- Robert, a historic buildings advisor on behalf of Haberdashers Aske's Boys School in Elstree, Hertfordshire, has been given the task of unpicking the history of Aldenham House. He sent me an interesting [leaflet on the gardens](#) which at Vicary's death in 1932 were looked after by 58 gardeners and the envy of Kew.

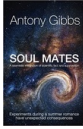
Artists:

Tracking our Italian cousins

An Italian who contacted me about Gibbs gravestones that he had uncovered in the overgrown abandoned English cemetery in Genoa peeked my curiosity about merchant connections there, so when Juliet and I recently made a trip to the lakes in Northern Italy I took the opportunity to investigate.

Constance Gibbs, the only daughter of Charles Gibbs who lived much of his life and died in Genoa, married Captain Giulio Adamoli. Giulio fought with Garibaldi, travelled widely, was a Senator, and represented Italy for his last 20 years in Cairo, where he died. We visited his family "castle" in Besozzo, now converted to apartments, and had lunch at a mountain refuge high above Lake Maggiore dedicated to their favourite grandson Giulio Adamoli De Grandi who died at 20 in a climbing accident on the sea cliffs at Portofino.

I have since had exchanges with a guy that used to play in the grounds of the castle with another grandson; he has sent me various photos and stories, but it seems that the only descendant left is an elderly great-granddaughter in Rome whose father was a drug addict who deserted the family.

Nicholas Gibbs has researched various family connections; he took a DNA test which indicated a fascinating DNA chart of Italians with the same DNA; the result of the Gibbs presence on the peninsula?

Look on the Bright side

Prim Bright from Australia has been investigating the Gibbs and Bright family connections; next year 2018, marks the 200th anniversary of the closely entwined business and family relationships.

Richard Bright of Ham Green, Somerset and George Gibbs Snr. of Redland, Glos., were friends and well established West Indian Merchants when they decided, in 1818, to bring Richard's son Robert into the firm, which by 1839 became Gibbs Bright & Co. It was by 1963 the largest trading partnership in the Southern Hemisphere with interests in mining, shipping, pastoral activities (with several million acres of sheep and cattle stations), insurance, building materials, timber and merchant banking.

The young Robert Bright, aged 23, and George Gibbs, 39, based in Bristol, took over their fathers' trading business, expanded into Australia with branches in Melbourne, Brisbane and Sydney, as well as Dunedin in New Zealand. The company was owned by the two families until the 1980 acquisition by HSBC. During these years there were many working visits by Gibbs family members to Australia and Bright family members to London.

Inevitably such a close association between two families resulted in marriages which brought delight to their parents. Robert and Caroline (née Tyndall) Bright's daughter Isabel Marianne married the Rev. John Lomax Gibbs in 1860. Their daughter Isabel Alice Gibbs married Professor Dudley Julius Medley in 1890 and their son married his third cousin Emmeline, the daughter of Alice Clara Franck Newbolt née Bright in 1916. Furthermore, James Franck Bright's daughter Emily Gertrude married John Arthur Gibbs in 1902, and many other interconnecting marriages involving the Tyndalls and the McCauslands.

Future of the Gibbs Family Tree

I noted in my previous that Gibbs Family Tree website has become outdated and inflexible. I have now

set up an alternative website for development and testing which I intend to switch over to when all family information is copied over and sponsors happy for me to do so. It has several advantages:

- easy for me to update and add new pages and features to
- displays better on mobile devices (phones, tablets etc.)
- based on commercial software which is frequently enhanced and maintained
- tree provides web privacy for living persons (only family with a login can see photos and info)
- will be much cheaper to run in the long term than our current bespoke tree
